Guide to Course Credits and Equivalents

Transfer of Credit Policy: Work done at another institution will be given credit at Randolph College provided the course work represents collegiate course work 1) relevant to the liberal arts degree program of study and 2) with course content and level of instruction resulting in student competencies at least equivalent to those of students enrolled in the College's own undergraduate program.

International Baccalaureate (IB) Program: Entering students who have earned scores of 5 or better on IB Higher Level subject exams may be considered for advanced placement in college courses and for credit toward graduation at the discretion of the department chairs involved.

Advanced Placement (AP) Program: Entering students who have earned scores of 3 or better on AP Program exams may be considered for advanced placement in college courses and for credit toward graduation at the discretion of the department chairs involved. Most departments require a minimum score of 4 before granting credit will be considered.
