Health Services

The major in health services provides students with a foundation in the social, psychological and scientific knowledge essential to the practice of health care in modern society. This major is restricted to students planning to apply for admission to Johns Hopkins University School of Nursing or Vanderbilt University School of Nursing. Because of the nature of the program, that admission to the nursing school is not guaranteed, and because student plans can change, the student is required to choose a departmental "track" within the pre-nursing program. Should the student change her plans or be denied admission to the nursing program, she will complete a major in her chosen department during her fourth year at Randolph College. The student will declare her interest in the program formally at the time when she declares her major, but because of the need to ensure that all nursing prerequisites are met as well as the need to meet graduation requirements for Randolph College, the student should consult with the program advisor as soon as possible. She is also strongly encouraged to contact the admissions office at Johns Hopkins University or Vanderbilt University to alert them to her plans to apply. Internship or volunteer activities in a health related area will strengthen the application and are also strongly encouraged.

Note: This major is only open to students who attend the 3-2 nursing program at Johns Hopkins University or Vanderbilt University to complete their Senior Program.
