- A. MAT/MEd will both start online with new cohort beginning next month. What other supports might be valuable for future students?

Moving forward, see a need for coordination of this information/thinking through the unique aspects of communication for fully online degree-seeking students.

Need to investigate providing time limits on exams for students so that we can provide double time, etc, for students with accommodations.

- F. Connor- Connection with other grad students and a sense of community is very important. The network that the students make here will continue to be important, so are there ways that we can build in a sense of connection among our online students so that they are part of a community?
- III. Update: SPED licensure at the undergraduate level
 - A. Program was successfully submitted to VDOE. The next step is a vote through ABTEL, which occurs September 2024. This is a licensure program. We anticipate being able to offer this at the undergraduate level during the 2025-2026 level.
