#### **ASSISTANCE**

#### **DAY PASS**

If you are staying off-campus and would like access to designated buildings, you can get a Paw Pass for the day. These can be checked out at the Welcome Center/Registration in Main Hall Lobby.

#### **HOUSE RULES**

Please note, there are additional charges for your key and Paw Pass if lost or not returned: \$25 for a lost Paw Pass and \$35 for a lost key.
