WEBB HALL ISOLATION HOUSING GUIDELINES

- You may choose to socialize with other students who are also in Webb Hall during your time in isolation; you are not required to wear a mask while indoors in Webb Hall.
- You may use the designated outdoor space to get fresh air, pick up contactless deliveries, etc. while masked. This space is located at the back porch and grassy area facing the Terrell Health and Counseling Centers building.
- Use trash bags provided and place trash outside the door daily by 1pm.
- Please use designated washer/dryer combo units for laundering needs, located in units 122, 100, and in the kitchen on the lower terrace level (where the large common room is located).
- Students may utilize the common kitchens, located in unit 100 and on the lower terrace level.
- Meals will be delivered at approximately 12pm for lunch and 5pm for dinner in the front lobby
- Breakfast will be delivered with your dinner
- You may order food from off-campus locations for contactless delivery outside the building to the back porch area only
- Practice self-care daily.
- Please remove all food from the refrigerator and cabinets upon completion of your stay and return your Webb key to the Reception and Information Desk after you have removed all of your personal items.

STUDENT POLICY: ISOLATION FOR COVID-19 (SARS-COV-2)

ISOLATION (POSITIVE FOR COVID-19)

During times of increased COVID-19 cases among students, Randolph College students who test positive for COVID-19 will be expected to leave campus due to the limited space that is available for isolation. Students should return to their place of residence outside of campus for a period of at least 5 days from test date (Day 0), regardless of vaccination status or symptom onset. If no symptoms are present on Day 5 (or if initial symptoms have improved and no fever is present for 24 hours without the use of medication) AND a negative rapid antigen test (not PCR) result is submitted on Day 5, normal campus activities can resume while wearing a mask* for an additional 5 days. If there is no rapid antigen test option available on Day 5, or if the result remains positive, or if symptoms appear and are not improving, the infected person must remain in isolation until the above requirements can be met (up to Day 10). No test is required to return after 10 days of isolation, as long as symptoms are improving. During times of low to moderate transmission on campus, students may remain on campus for the duration of their isolation period (Webb Hall), or they may elect to return to their off-campus residence. This will be determined at the time of diagnosis by the director of the Health Center, along with staff from the Dean of Students Office, based on space available.
