Also, the College will publish, for internal use, a student directory including names, pictures, ndy, class year, and contact information. <sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> Upon request, the College will disclose information from the student's education records to the student's parents under one of the following circumstances: 1) by written consent of the student; 2) by evidence that the student was declared as a dependent on the most recent Federal Income Tax form; and 3) in compliance with a subpoena. In cases of divorce, separation or custody, when only one parent declares the student as dependent, Randolph may grant equal access to information from the student's education records. However, when access is given to one parent, the College must grant equal access to the other parent upon request, unless there is a court order, state statute, or legally binding document stating otherwise.
